

CURIOUS CRITTERS & BUSH TUCKER TRIALS

Last week we invited in Danny Jubb, owner of Curious Critters, into school to deliver an engaging session to students on the adaptations of animals.

Students were given the opportunity to observe and hold a range of different species which included Leopard Geckos, Snakes, Tarantulas, Owls, Skinny pigs, and Millipedes.

It was a chance for our students to learn all about the animals, as well as to hold and touch them in a hands-on experience.

The students engaged really well with plenty of 'oohs and ahhs' in the session and genuinely loved getting involved with the handling of the animals.

The snake was a popular animal with the students for holding and some staff and students also took part in a bush tucker trial task and ate crickets and meal worms. Safe to say the author of this newsletter was not one!

HIGH SCHOOL

WOW WEEK: STEM IN THE FAST LANE

A group of students from Years 7 to 9 enjoyed a full day investigating different STEM elements that contribute to the performance go-karts. Students experienced sessions based around aerodynamics, ergonomics, careers, designing logos and karts before working in a group to create a presentation that summarised what they had learned.

The WOW came when the students had the opportunity to drive an electric Go-Kart around an inflatable race track and apply what they had learned to achieve the fastest laps possible.

All students were excellent and the feedback was overwhelmingly positive!



We also had fourteen Y9 students visit West Lancashire College to take on the 'Pit Stop Challenge'. Students had the opportunity to work in teams to change a real Formula One car tyre in the fastest time possible. Students also completed a Hydro-Car challenge that involved them constructing a car that was powered by generating Hydrogen by passing an electric current through water.

Both of the sessions developed students' knowledge of how STEM subjects are applied in the real world and gave them a valuable hands-on experience.

All students worked excellently on the day and thoroughly enjoyed the experience!
