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At Up Holland School, we firmly believe in the development of the individual student, something that we promote through our prominent 'Character and Culture' programme.

This programme provides opportunities for students:

Students begin to develop their LORIC values through our 'Character and Culture' programme. This begins in Y7 and continues through to Y11, with students completing a range of activities from an approved list. challenging as they move through the levels, with children achieving 'Apprentice' 'Graduate' and ultimately 'Masters' accreditation.

Rewards and sanctions are consistently applied across the school and this helps us maintain a supportive environment in which our young people can thrive and achieve.
