DEDICATED TO CHARACTER, CULTURE AND LEARNING

At Up Holland, we firmly believe in the development of the individual student, something that we promote through our prominent Personal Development programme.

This programme provides opportunities for students:

- To develop important values
- To make themselves more prepared for further education and attractive to future employers

The programme focuses on five key values (LORIC) that employers consider to be most desirable:

DEDICATED TO A CURRICULUM THAT IS BOTH INNOVATIVE AND PERSONAL

At Up Holland, we offer a broad and balanced curriculum, ensuring each student is engaged and working to the best of their ability.

The key emphasis in all lessons is that students develop a real passion for learning and are challenged to make maximum progress. We offer a range of subjects at KS3 and KS4 which provides students with the opportunity to succeed, achieve and develop skills for their future. Our curriculum supports, stretches and challenges our students by delivering a personalised approach for each and every student. We embrace new technologies, with subject areas having access to ICT facilities and classrooms having SMART boards that are linked to tablets, enabling the children to interact with the teacher and their own learning.

ENRICHMENT

Enrichment opportunities are at the heart of our school community; we are dedicated to ensuring our school is a place where happy relationships are fostered. We offer our students various enrichment activities across all areas of school, giving all students opportunities to learn about subjects beyond the classroom with local, national and international educational visits.

The range and variety of activities on offer is a real strength of the school, encouraging our young people to develop friendships, practice new skills and embed our core values. Our Music and Performing Arts ensembles perform regularly in the local community and our half termly Friday 'Jam sessions' are extremely popular, especially when held outside in the Community Garden. 
All of our students are encouraged to support community activities throughout the year. They embrace the opportunity to fundraise for a wide range of charities and good causes.

STUDENT WELCOME


A very warm welcome to Up Holland from the Junior Leadership Team. We work hard to provide a link between the students, staff and the wider community to ensure that the best learning environment is created for everyone. Our school has an atmosphere and ethos that supports all students, giving them a 'voice' and the ability to communicate their wishes and feelings through us and their year group representatives. We understand that every student is different, with different skills, personalities and aspirations. We encourage and support everyone to be the best that they can be, striving for excellence in all that they do.

STUDENT VOICE

Students make a contribution to school life through their involvement with the Student Council. Within the full Executive Council we have four Sub Councils that are responsible for promoting our school

values. We aim to develop confidence and leadership skills with students working with younger year groups, leading assemblies and being involved in interviewing prospective new staff to the school.

Our prefect system starts in March of Y10 and continues through to March of Y11. This allows Y10 to take on some key responsibility, whilst enabling Y11 to prepare for exams. The Junior Leadership Team, consisting of Lead Prefects, play an active part in whole school decision making and lead the Student Council sub teams, as well as delivering regular year group assemblies.



DEDICATED TO PROVIDING EXCELLENT CARE AND SUPPORT

Because each of our students is an individual, we understand that each have their own particular strengths and needs.

At Up Holland High School, we commit to providing a structured programme of teaching and learning, within a caring, supportive and secure community.

Each new student is welcomed into a Personal Development group when they join us and their Personal Development Tutor becomes a key person in their everyday school life. Each year group is overseen by a Senior Personal Development Manager, to ensure both the academic and personal development of individual students.

A clear rewards and sanction system engages students in their learning, alongside termly reward trips and reward assemblies. Rewards and sanctions are consistently applied across the school, helping us to maintain a supportive environment in which our young people can thrive and achieve.

We firmly believe that home communication is a key to building relationships with families. With this in mind, school uses an online platform, 'Synergy', whereby parents have their own portal. 'Synergy' includes information showing the student's timetable, homework, attendance, behaviour, letters to parents and a school calendar tailored with key dates for the student.

All communication by email and texts are also stored within the parents' portal

We understand the importance of offering students effective Careers Advice and Guidance throughout their school lives. This provides a smooth and successful transition into further education when they leave us. ensuring readiness for college life or the world of work. All children have access to careers information, advice and guidance from our Careers Advisor. The students also have numerous opportunities to meet employers, visit colleges and universities throughout their time at Up Holland so that they can get a taste for life beyond school. This enables students to make more informed choices
