Uniform – High standards

No hoodies/zip up hoodies / fleeces that aren't school branded. These will be confiscated.

Coats need to be off when you enter the building. Hoods should not be up unless it is raining.

No sports brands, no trainers unless using for PE, no gold bows, no boots. If you are worried that they aren't correct – ask your PD Tutor

Attendance

- Aim for 100% attendance.
- Minimum expectation of 97%.
- 90% attendance = ½ day missed every week.
- Phone us to tell us why your child is absent.
- Only allow days at home for genuine illness.
- Avoid holidays in school time, they will not be authorised.
- Medical evidence will need to be provided if attendance falls below 93%.
- If you have concerns ring Mrs Lowery (Attendance Officer).
- Attendance form groups termly review extra support.

Missing 17 days in one year can mean dropping a full grade at GCSE!

If you have 5 days of unauthorised absence in a term school has the right to apply for a Fixed Penalty Notice to be issued.

Reporting home

- You will receive three reports throughout the year, December 2021, March 2022 and July 2022. The reports will be slightly different this year but you will receive information on the following at some point throughout the year:
- Attendance
- Attitude to Learning
 - This is a point score 1 to 5. It is linked to how focused, motivated, engaged in their learning
 and the effort taken in completing their work. A high score usually links to good progress, a
 low score usually links to more limited progress
- Homework
 - you can see if homework has been set on Synergy but the standard at which it has been completed will be clear for you to see for each subject.
- LORIC and excellence house points
- Attainment- level descriptors are replacing GCSE grades at KS3

Levels of attainment

Mastered – Students have demonstrated a comprehensive understanding of all concepts and skills in the work being taught and assessed.

Secure- Students have a secure understanding of the main concepts and skills when applied to familiar contexts in the work being taught and assessed

Developing- Students have grasped some of the main ideas and skills in the work being taught and assessed, other aspects of these ideas and skills still require development

Emerging- Students have begun to grasp some of the main ideas and skills in the work that is being taught and assessed


- HOLLY J. SEIRUP
- More important indicator of success than socioeconomic/educational status of parents (OECD/PISA 2009)
- Aids with cognitive development and impacts across the curriculum likely to do 'significantly better', with a 9.9% advantage in Maths by age 16. (IoE, London, 2013).
- Science achievement: Researchers found that the strongest factor affecting pupils' science scores is reading comprehension (EEF, September 2017)
- Reading improves teenagers' vocabulary by 26% (Centre for Longitudinal Studies, November 2017)

Reading @UHHS

- All students are tested for RA on entry
- Personal development time reader
- Access to the library during breaks and lunchtimes
- Reading activities throughout the year
- Reading interventions when necessary: IDL, buddy readers and the fluency programme
