



# DEDICATED TO CHARACTER, CULTURE AND LEARNING

At Up Holland, we firmly believe in the development of the individual student, something that we promote through our prominent Personal Development programme.

This programme provides opportunities for students:

- To develop important values
- To make themselves more prepared for further education and attractive to future employers.

The programme focuses on five key values and skill (LORIC) that employers consider to be most desirable:

In addition, students develop their character and understanding of the world of work through our 'Personal development Programme'. This begins in Y7 and continues through to Y11, with students completing a range of sessions from our teaching staff and visiting professionals.

# DEDICATED TO A CURRICULUM THAT IS BOTH INNOVATIVE AND PERSONAL

At Up Holland, we offer a broad, balanced and inclusive curriculum, ensuring each student is engaged and working to the best of their ability.

The key emphasis in all lessons is that students develop a real passion for learning and are challenged to make maximum progress. We offer a range of subjects at KS3 and KS4 which provides students with the opportunity to succeed, achieve and develop skills for their future. Our curriculum supports, stretches and challenges our students by delivering a personalised approach for each and every student. We embrace new technologies, with subject areas having access to ICT facilities and classrooms having SMART boards that enable the children to interact with the teacher and their own learning.

#### ENRICHMENT

Enrichment opportunities are at the heart of our school community; we are dedicated to ensuring our school is a place where happy relationships are fostered. We offer our students various enrichment activities across all areas of school, giving all students opportunities to learn about subjects beyond the classroom with local, national and international educational visits.

# DEDICATED TO A SMOOTH AND SUPPORTED START TO SCHOOL

We understand how important it is to provide a smooth and successful transition into secondary school and ensure that every student feels ready for secondary school life.

The transition journey begins with visits and taster sessions in Y5 and concludes with our new intake evening for Y6 in the summer term. This gives parents and carers the opportunity to meet key staff and be well informed of our values and expectations. Our transition team place great importance on working collaboratively with primary feeder schools to gather the vital pastoral and academic information needed to guarantee a positive start to Y7. This may include further visits for those who require additional support in the transition process. You can be confident that your child will feel nurtured, supported and happy as they are welcomed into our school community.

#### STUDENT WELCOME

A very warm welcome to Up Holland from the Junior Leadership Team. We work hard to provide a link between the students, staff and the wider community to ensure that the best learning environment is created for everyone. Our school has an atmosphere and ethos that supports all students, giving them a 'voice' and the ability to communicate their wishes and feelings through us and their year group representatives. We understand that every student is different, with different skills, personalities and aspirations. We encourage and support everyone to be the best that they can be, striving for excellence in all that they do.

#### STUDENT VOICE

Students make a contribution to school life through their involvement with the Student Council. We aim to develop confidence and leadership skills, with students working with younger year groups, leading assemblies and being involved in interviewing prospective new staff to the school. Our prefect system starts in the Summer Term for Year 9 and continues through to the Spring Term for Y11. This allows Y9 and Y10 to take on some key responsibility, whilst enabling Y11 to prepare for exams. The Junior Leadership Team, consisting of Lead Prefects, whoplay an active part in whole school decision making and lead the Student Council sub teams, as well as delivering regular year group assemblies.

# DEDICATED TO PROVIDING EXCELLENT CARE AND SUPPORT



At Up Holland High School, we commit to providing a structured programme of teaching and learning, within a caring, supportive and secure community. Each new student is welcomed into a Personal Development group when they join us and their Personal Development Tutor becomes a key person in their everyday school life. Each year group is overseen by a Head of Year, to ensure both the academic and personal development of individual students.



A clear rewards and sanction system engages students in their learning, alongside termly reward trips and reward assemblies. Rewards and sanctions are consistently applied across the school, helping us to maintain a supportive environment in which our young people can thrive and achieve. We firmly believe that home communication is a key to building relationships with families. With this in mind, school uses an online platform, 'Synergy', whereby parents have their own portal. 'Synergy' includes information showing the student's timetable, home learning, attendance, behaviour, letters to parents and a school calendar tailored with key dates for the student. All communication by email and texts are also stored within the parents' portal on Synergy.



We understand the importance of offering students effective Careers Advice and Guidance throughout their school lives. This provides a smooth and successful transition into further education when they leave us, ensuring readiness for college life or the world of work. All children have access to careers information, advice and guidance from our Careers Advisor. The students also have numerous opportunities to meet employers, visit colleges and universities throughout their time at Up Holland so that they can get a taste for life beyond school. This enables students to make more informed choices about the most appropriate pathway for them.
